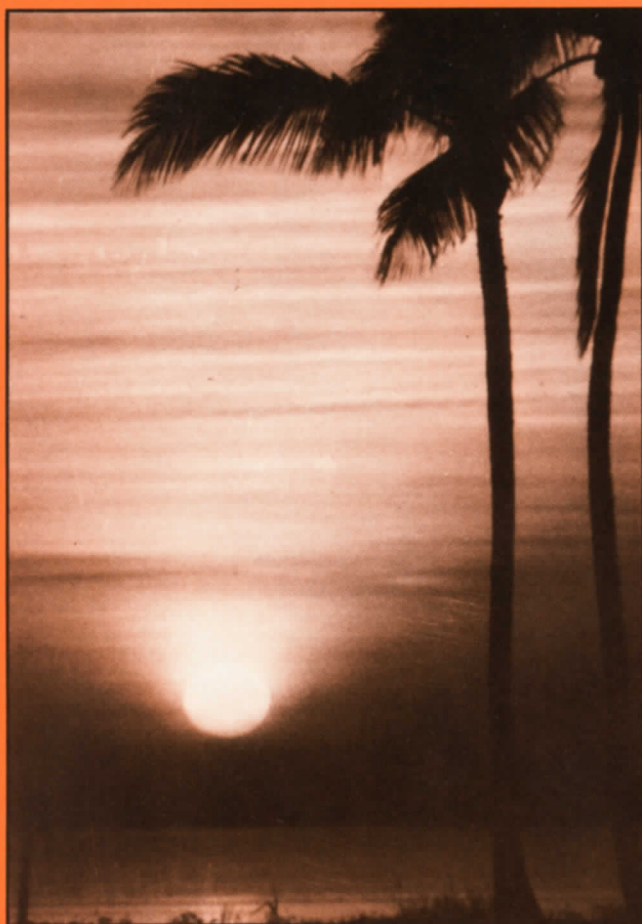

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## PURPOSE

The purpose of the **Florida Association for Behavior Analysis** is to promote the use of effective and humane behavior analysis procedures with normal and developmentally disabled children and adults throughout the state of Florida. This goal is to be achieved by providing a professional organization that members can look to for support and continued education as the field of behavior analysis develops and expands. The association will meet the needs of its members by organizing an annual state-wide conference for the exchange of ideas and data-based research related to the delivery of behavioral therapy and programming. In addition, the association will provide a mechanism for improving the quality of behavioral services by publishing a quarterly newsletter which will highlight recent advances in the field and keep members abreast of new developments in behavior modification guidelines, new facilities and programs being established and funding patterns and trends relating to behavioral services in Florida. The **Florida Association for Behavior Analysis** will also publish an annual directory listing all members and their special areas of interest and expertise.

Membership is open to anyone actually engaged in doing applied research or providing behavior therapy or programming in Florida.
