Keynote Address...

The Renaissance Education Foundation shows positive reinforcement can work to motivate students

A High School in Nevada more than quadrupled the number of "A" students in two years, from 72 to 330.

The number of Honor Roll students jumped 85 percent in three years at a Tennessee High School.

In an Arkansas High School, the number of dropouts was reduced by 88 percent.

The number of suspensions was reduced by 55 percent in a North Carolina High School.

This is a sample of some of the data presented by the Renaissance Education Foundation. Their philosophy is simple, "what gets rewarded, gets accomplished." This con-

cept certainly sounds familiar to Behavior Analysts. The Renaissance program has discovered some creative ways to reinforce students for improved attendance and grades, reductions in disciplinary suspensions and dropouts, and to reinforce increased teacher attendance.

What is innovative in their approach is the community involvement which schools cultivate to make the rewards meaningful. Local businesses get involved and work with the school to offer such rewards as discounts for "gold card" students, daily and weekly

Just Announced: New HRS Head to Give Invited Address

Secretary Jim Towey will address the conference on Friday morning.

The new Secretary to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services has agreed to give an invited address at the FABA conference. Jim Towey was appointed Secretary of HRS on July 16, 1993 and is taking the reins following the temporary appointment of Lieutenant Governor Buddy MacKay.

Secretary Towey is facing a challenging road ahead with HRS coming in on the heels of a grand jury investigation into millions of dollars in overpayments made by the state's computerized welfare system. The FLORIDA system is also under scrutiny for its apparent lack of capacity to handle the needs of the state. In addition, Towey will be overseeing the reorganization of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services which was begun under MacKay's supervision..

Secretary Towey will speak at the conference just prior to the Presidential Address on Friday, September 24, at 10:45 a.m.
